MATTERS ARISING

- ① MR. WOLFENDEN CAME TO TALK ABOUT LOCAL LISTED BUILDINGS AND THE ROLE OF THE SOCIETY IN RELATION TO THIS!
 - a) FROM THE OFFICIAL COUNCIL BOOK ON LISTED BUILDINGS WE SHOULD FAMILIARISE OURSELVES WITH THOSE IN OUR LOCALITY, AND POSSIBLE LISTINGS OF OTHERS NOT ALREADY LISTED.
 - b) CONSERVATION AREA - RMBC WILL REVIEW BOUNDARIES AND SOCIETY MAY WISH THIS TO BE ALTERED/RE CONSIDERED
 - c) THRESHOLD SIGNING - TOURIST INFORMATION SIGN MAY NEED RE-DOING / AREA AROUND CLEARED UP / IMPROVED
 - d) TREE + SHRUB PLANTING
 - e) ISSUES SUCH AS PEBBLE-BASHING + RENDERING MAY NOT BE IN KEEPING WITH AREA
 - f) INVOLVEMENT WITH OTHER GROUPS E.G. GROUNDWORK TRUST + RMBC LIGHTING ETC..
 - g) BE VIGILANT ABOUT LISTED BUILDINGS IN OUR AREA AND INCREASE AWARENESS OF OWNERS ABOUT ANY LISTED BUILDINGS AND THEIR STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS IF ALTERATIONS PLANNED.

NB. MR. WOLFENDEN MET WITH DIOCESE REPRESENTATIVE AND CHAIRMAN P.C.C. 2 WEEKS AGO TO DISCUSS ST. JAMES CE CHURCH (DERBY). THERE ARE NOW 3 YEARS TO GO TO FIND ALTERNATIVE USES FOR CHURCH BEFORE MEASURES ARE TAKEN FOR POSSIBLE DEMOLITION.

THESE MATTERS CAN BE DISCUSSED AT OUR NEXT MEETING.
